**Program Agreement**


This agreement shall commence as of August 1, 2025. This program agreement shall abide by all language of the Institutional Agreement between Grand Rapids Community College and Western Michigan University.

The BS in Early Childhood General and Special Education: Birth through Kindergarten prepares educators for work in a variety of early care and classroom settings serving infants through kindergarten age children. Following completion of the curriculum, graduates will be eligible for credentialing as early childhood/early childhood special education (ZN) teachers under MDE regulations.


All education students are coded Pre-Education upon admission to Western Michigan University (WMU). Candidates must apply for advancement to the Early Learning and Intervention professional program. Students will be permitted to enroll in upper-level professional education courses once admission requirements have been met and the upper-level application has been submitted and approved. To ensure a seamless transfer, GRCC students will need to meet these requirements and submit their upper-level application prior to enrolling in their first semester at WMU. Students should meet with an Academic Advisor in WMU's College of Education and Human Development Advising Office to discuss professional level admission requirements upon applying to WMU.



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
