

Global Education Merit Scholarships

WMU is proud of its deep and historic commitment to international student success and well-being. Our Global Education Merit Scholarship, valued up to \$10,000 per academic year, can be applied to your WMU tuition throughout the duration of your program. No additional scholarship application is necessary.

- » Duration: Up to eight semesters (undergraduate); up to four semesters (graduate).
- » **Eligibility:** A minimum 3.5 GPA is required.
- » Deadline: Undergraduate scholarships are awarded on a rolling basis as funding is available. Graduate applicants must submit their completed application for admission to WMU by February 15.

Merit scholarships are available only for degreeseeking students on F-1 or J-1 status. They cannot be combined with governmental/NGO scholarships or WMU full assistantships. Terms apply.

Graduate students may have other sources of funding from their academic units, such as research or teaching assistantships. Graduate students should inquire with their department for available funding opportunities.

Our Intensive English program prepares you to use English effectively as a university student or career professional. Activities simulate future academic or professional environments, and instruction is provided in-person for all proficiency levels.

- Short-term, on-demand English language learning programs are also available for small groups. The American University Experience offers students a tailored approach to English language learning and cultural immersion.

International Student and Scholar Services oversees recruitment, admissions, orientation and immigration support for international students. IMMERSIVE ENGLISH LANGUAGE STUDY

The Center for English Language and Culture for International Students provides short-term and semester-long intensive English language study. The Center organizes cultural, recreational and volunteer opportunities to help international students engage with the campus and local community.





A GLOBALLY ENGAGED CAMPUS
