Global Education Merit Scholarships

WMU is proud of its deep and historic commitment to international student success and well-being. Our Global Education Merit Scholarship, valued up to \$10,000 per academic year, can be applied to your WMU tuition throughout the duration of your program. No additional scholarship application is necessary.

- » **Duration:** Up to eight semesters (undergraduate); up to four semesters (graduate).
- » **Eligibility:** A minimum 3.5 GPA is required.
- » **Deadline:** Undergraduate scholarships are awarded on a rolling basis as funding is available. Graduate applicants must submit their completed application for admission to WMU by **February 15**.

Merit scholarships are available only for degree-seeking students on F-1 or J-1 status. They cannot be combined with governmental/NGO scholarships or WMU full assistantships. Terms apply.

Graduate students may have other sources of funding from their academic units, such as research or teaching assistantships. Graduate students should inquire with their department for available funding opportunities.
