This course provides an overview of the Chinese, Japanese and other Asian economies. Topics include:

- economic systems,
- development and industrial policies,
- achievements, problems and reforms in these economies.

Coverage will be primarily on the East Asian economies and the course will introduce to the students about selective Asian economies in the fastest growing areas of the world. It will compare and contrast their similarities and differences with the U.S.

Students will gain basic understanding of the working and evolution of these economies and to be able to form informed opinions and decisions in their respective disciplines on issues and developments related to these economies.
