Program Agreement

This agreement shall commence as of August 28, 2024. This program agreement shall abide by all language of the Institutional Agreement between Kalamazoo Valley Community College and Western Michigan University.

For the 2024-2025 catalog year, the Elementary Education Curriculum is designed to prepare students to assume teaching responsibilities in two certified Michigan Department of Education Grade Bands: PK-3 and 3-6. A Bachelor of Science degree with a major in Elementary Education completes the course and clinical experience requirements for a Michigan Standard Teaching Certificate in both grade bands. Graduates of this program will be eligible to teach all subjects to PK-6 students in self-contained classrooms.

All education students are coded Pre-Education upon admission to Western Michigan University (WMU). Candidates must apply for advancement to the Elementary professional program. Pre-education students are not permitted to enroll in upper-level professional education courses until admission requirements are met and upper-level application is submitted and approved. Students should meet with an Academic Advisor in WMU's College of Education and Human Development Advising Office to learn how to apply for upper-level admission upon applying to WMU.
