



The WMU Faculty Senate provides the following guidance as instructors prepare syllabi for the upcoming academic year.

For [syllabus development](#), including a WMU sample syllabus template, instructional resources, and events and opportunities, support is available from the [Office of Faculty Development](#) (OFD) and the [Center for Teaching, Learning, and Development](#) (CTLD). The WMU sample syllabus template is available on the [CTLD syllabus website](#) includes both Faculty Senate-required and recommended syllabus language, is Universal Design for Learning (UDL)-informed, and meets digital accessibility standards.

Each instructor is required to make available to students a course syllabus that shall contain:

- Instructor information
 - Name of instructor assigned to teach the course
 - Instructors contact information, including email address and office hours
- Course information
 - Course name
 - Location including building and room number if in-person, or virtual link
 - Meeting time
 - Prerequisites
- Textbook and course materials
- Course technology requirements (if applicable)
- WMU Essential Studies / General Education Area (if applicable)
- Student Learning Outcomes / objectives and outcomes
- Course calendar
 - Date, time, and location of final exam (if applicable)
 - Due dates of assignments
- Grade Scale
- Course policies

- Attendance policy
- Classroom etiquette
- Statement regarding the use of artificial intelligence (AI) tools (e.g., ChatGPT). The syllabus must make the expectations about AI use in the course explicit.

Faculty Senate first approved syllabi language – 6 April 2005.

The Faculty Senate Executive Board approved (6 November 2015) the below syllabus statement regarding Sexual and Gender-Based Harassment and Violence, Intimate Partner Violence, and Stalking Policy and Procedures:

Students and instructors are responsible for making themselves aware of and abiding by the “Western Michigan University Sexual and Gender-Based Harassment and Violence, Intimate Partner Violence, and Stalking [Policy and Procedures](#)” related to prohibited sexual misconduct under Title IX, the Clery Act and the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA). Under this policy, responsible employees (including instructors) are required to report claims of sexual misconduct to the Title IX Coordinator or designee (located in the Office of Institutional Equity). Responsible employees are not confidential resources.
