## Immunization Requirements:

WMU PA Program now requires proof of the following titers and immunizations on all students:

- Tdap vaccine
- Influenza vaccine
- Hepatitis B vaccine
- Measles titer
- Mumps titer
- Rubella titer
- Varicella titer
- 2-step TB test

## From the Bureau of Health Professions:

Under Article 15 the Michigan Public Health  
Code requires licensees and registrants to  
report a change in name or mailing address not  
more than 30 days after the change occurs.  
(MCL 333.16192).

tasks. Electronic health records have taken  
away some of the thinking process inherent  
in our profession. If you are looking for  
ways to help both the student and  
yourselves, ask them to design or improve  
some of your templates during down time  
or at the end of the day. This will ensure  
that they have looked at all aspects of  
patient encounters: history, PE, diagnostic  
testing, patient education, and billing.

in 2013 PAs will be allowed to claim  
**Category I CME Credit** for

twenty hours per two-year logging cycle.
